ID Types Currently in Use

- Breed Registry Number
- American ID = Breed registry number
- NEUS numbering system
- Manufacturer coded RFID number
- AIN (840) number



Unique Id is key!

- Unique ID:
 - Doesn't mean it is official!
 - It cannot repeat
 - Required to get a genetic evaluation
 - Required to receive a genomic test
- Farm Management Solutions
- Industry could continue to use American ID



Why Official ID is Preferred

- Calfhood vaccination
- Animals move
- Locations receiving animals that may require a CVI
- Minimize number of tags
- One single unique ID (both printed and electronic)

Legacy Systems

- No longer a need for American ID for printing on visible panel or RFID ear tags (no cost difference with 840)
- American ID numbers on metal tags will still be around for a while longer because many were printed and they are cheap and unique (cost difference with 840)
- On farm technology that is not using the 840 numbering system but will adopt to 840
- NEUS tags continue to be used by states so DHI's will continue to record these as long as they are not duplicates.

Areas of continued use of American ID

- We will still need American ID for assigning unique ID's that are not printed on a visible or electronic identifier
 - Breed registries using tattoos, freeze brands, photo's and sketches
 - Third Party service providers that need a unique ID but Farm does not want a tag
- Council on Dairy Cattle Breeding will ultimately decide what unique/official ID will continue to be accepted for use in genetic evaluations in the dairy industry.
